A: The graduation certificate obtained by our graduating students is internationally recognized. After graduation, students have the option to continue their education directly within our institution or choose to pursue studies at prestigious universities around the world, including Taiwan, the United States, the United Kingdom, Australia, Indonesia, and other countries.

Language Learning

Q: WHAT IS THE LEARNING APPROACH FOR STUDYING TRADITIONAL CHINESE IN INDONESIA? HOW WOULD STUDENTS' CHINESE PROFICIENCY DEVELOP IN THIS CONTEXT?

A: Our school's students begin exposure to Mandarin Phonetic Symbols (Zhuyin Fuhao)and Pinyin from kindergarten. Upon entering elementary school, in addition to learning Traditional Chinese in Chinese classes, they are taught subjects such as Mathematics, Life Skills, Information Technology, Social Studies, and Natural Sciences in Traditional Chinese. This comprehensive approach allows students to progressively enhance their Chinese language proficiency. Most of our elementary school graduates achieve a foundation level in the Mandarin Proficiency Test, equivalent to fluent oral communication with native Chinese speakers.

Academic System

A: Our school's academic system is generally similar to that of Indonesia and Canada. The elementary school phase consists of 6 years, the junior high school phase includes 3 years, and the high school phase spans 3 years as well. Each academic year is divided into two semesters, with the first semester running from August 1st to January 31st of the following year, and the second semester from February 1st to July 31st. For our Grade 8 students transferring to other schools, it is equivalent to entering the second year of junior high school.

A: Our school's teaching approach emphasizes trilingual education, incorporating Chinese, English, and Indonesian. The curriculum is designed to meet the requirements of both the Taiwanese Ministry of Education and the Indonesian Ministry of Education's new curriculum. Compared to local Indonesian schools or other international schools, our curriculum is diverse, rich, and offers greater depth and breadth. This provides students with a competitive advantage when applying to prestigious universities worldwide in the future.

Semester Breaks

Q: THE SCHOOL'S ACADEMIC CALENDAR FOLLOWS TAIWANESE SCHEDULE.
HOW DOES IT DIFFER FROM OTHER LOCAL SCHOOLS IN THE AREA?

A: The vacation schedule of JTS school for winter and summer breaks follows the Taiwanese academic calendar. The summer break spans a maximum of sixty days, from July 1st to August 29th, while the winter break is limited to twenty-one days, from January 21st to February 10th. During the semester, holiday arrangements align with local practices in Indonesia, with classes held from Monday to Friday and breaks on weekends, national holidays, and public holidays.
